Styling extensions Technicians can now “style” your lash extensions to complement your specific eye color. So, like, if you have green eyes, they might throw some subtle greens in there. Noor Daoudi from Xtreme Lashes (a top extension supplier) says a big red flag is when a spa charges less than \$250 and finishes in 30 minutes—it means they aren’t taking the time to do a good job. Perming Just like with regular hair, the process will involve a small rod and perming solution. Veronica Mihaila from NYC’s Spa Ja says if you try it, make sure your technician has certification from a reputable manufacturer. And don’t ever get at-home kits off the Internet, which are way dangerous.

Tinting Since the color is nonpermanent, it’s not supposed to stain or irritate. Shayla Crawford from Astrids Day Spa in Springfield, Mo., suggests that fair blondes do it if they want a solid base color—this way they won’t have to pile on lots of dark mascara.
